2. According to Ephesians 4:9-16, who is called to do the work of the ministry? What should the role of pastors be?
3. Remember, Paul wrote to the Romans before he has ever visited them. What confidence does the gospel give Paul about the Roman church’s ministry according to Romans 15:14-21?
4. In Luke 22:24-34, Jesus deals with true greatness, sin and restoration. What can we learn about the relationship of these three things from this passage?
5. Matthew 18:15-35 contains the section on church discipline, which is often considered harsh by many. How does the fuller context of the passage reveal gentleness, and also reveal the responsibilities to the entire body?
