Leviticus 5:1-6:7

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Cross References: **Ecclesiastes 5:1-7; Matthew 12:33-37; Luke 19:1-10; Romans 3:10-31; James 5:1-6**

1. Why can our words have a condemning effect upon us? (Matthew 12)
2. How can careless words, even with a good intention, be condemning? (Ecclesiastes 5)
3. In what ways can we steal from another person without blatantly robbing them? (James 5)
4. What does Zacchaeus' response show us about the condition of his repentance? What was the necessary minimum response?
5. Why do you suppose God sees defrauding your neighbor, failing to testify to the truth and defiling the holy objects for worship with the same penalty? What does this tell you about the nature of these offenses?
6. What was the least expensive offering from chapter 1? What is the least expensive offering in this section? What does this tell you about the frequency of these offerings?
7. How does Leviticus 5:17 relate to Romans 3? How could you use either passage to share with a person who denies (or is unaware) of any sin in their life?

2. What is the "fallen condition focus" of this passage?
3. How does this passage help transform me more into the image of Christ?
