

Discussion points:

Lev 19:1-20:27

May 4-9

1. God will glorify Himself with us.

Read Romans 15:5-6

Ask your children the following:

1. Who gives you perseverance?
2. Who do we become of the same mind with?
3. Who should we be united with?
4. What is the end result?

God causes us to grow, stay faithful to Him and encourage us. God will also cause us to be united with each other as we focus on Jesus. Our unity will bring glory to God and to Jesus. God is the One who accomplishes this in us and He is the One who is glorified by it!

2. Since we are God's, we can glorify Him.

Read 1 Corinthians 6:19-20

Ask children the following:

1. What is a temple for the Holy Spirit?
2. Who gave you the Holy Spirit?
3. What was the price that bought us?
4. What should be our response?

We are able to glorify God because He gave us the Holy Spirit. He gave us the Holy Spirit when we respond to the gospel message. Jesus bought us with His blood. Once we are His and have been bought away from sin, the Holy Spirit then lives within us and allows us to glorify God with our actions.

3. Our actions can cause people to glorify God.

Read 1 Peter 2:12

Ask children the following:

1. How should we keep our behavior?
2. Who will notice your actions?
3. Will everyone like it when you obey God?
4. Why will they be won over?

People are watching you. They will notice when you obey God and love Him. Some people won't like this at first. It will make them angry and they will feel guilty. They may even accuse you of things that are not true. But, as you continue to love Jesus, even when they say untrue things about you, your reaction will cause them to see God. They may even be won over by the gospel!

4. Unlike us, Jesus perfectly resisted temptation every time!

Read 1 Peter 4:15-16

Ask children the following:

1. How shouldn't we suffer?
2. What is a good reason to suffer?
3. How should we respond?
4. Why should thank God?

Sometimes, God even gives us the opportunity to glorify Him when we suffer. These are not sufferings for sin, but sometimes people do not like Christians and respond angrily to them. If someone makes you suffer because they don't like that you are a Christian, this means they noticed you are a Christian! And that is a great thing!
