Remember Luke 9:46-50 (and check out some other passages in the box below). How often do you think this argument came up? How do you imagine Jesus each time He hears this?

Jesus prophesies more than Peter's denial. What else does he prophesy and why is this important?

Why do you think Jesus changes his instructions from earlier in Luke 9? Is this confusing to you? How can you see it was confusing to the disciples as well?

It's been a few weeks since we've asked about aspects of the Trinity. What do you see in this passage about the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit?

How does this passage challenge, encourage, correct, or teach you more about the beauty of the gospel? Did the passage convict you of sin, comfort you in suffering or confirm your salvation to you? If so, how?
