Be honest, you can't read it without singing it. (HT: The Byrds)

Someone is sure to ask, "If there's a time for everything, how can I tell if it's time for 'a' or for 'b?'" What would you say in response?

You can hear so many of the principles in verses 2-8 in the words Jesus shares in the gospels. What ones can you think of? (For instance, "time to hate": Luke 14:26)

Oh man, that "he has put eternity into man's hearts" is deeeep. What are the implications of that statement? How can that inform our evangelism?

"Eat and drink and take pleasure..." has already shown up in Ecclesiastes, and is going to show up again. Do you think the Preacher is calling us to hedonism? What then do you think he means?

The Preacher is not on a mission to clearly articulate the gospel. How does a clear understanding of the gospel either support a point he made in this passage, or correct an observation the Preacher makes?

How were you challenged, convicted, or comforted by this passage?
