

DANIEL 2:46-3:7 ~ November 1, 2020

Nebuchadnezzar is going to be a hard one to read. What about his response in verses 46-49 encourages you that he “gets it?” What about his response makes you think he doesn’t?

Compare and contrast this with Genesis 41 and Daniel 2:1-6. (If you did your homework that week, it should be fairly easy.)

How big is a cubit? So how big is the statue? What other monument or statues does it compare to in size?

Compare the two paragraphs of this section of Scripture. What do they reveal about Nebuchadnezzar’s view of worship? How does this probably mean he views “Daniel’s God?”

How do you see our culture crossing the line between respect/honor and worship? What false gods do you feel our world calls us to bow down to?

How does Jesus engage with Nebuchadnezzar’s statue? (Review Nebuchadnezzar’s dream last week, if you need a reminder.)

How can we encourage each other toward faithfulness to Christ?
