

*DANIEL 3:8-30 ~ November 8, 2020*

It would be tempting to believe God had abandoned you during a trial like Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego faced. However, in light of Isaiah 43:2, what does this trial actually prove?

Nebuchadnezzar gets enraged when the men refuse to worship his gods. What are the "gods of this world" that people become enraged when Christians refuse to bow down to them?

How is Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego's statement in verses 16-18 a picture of Christ in the garden of Gethsemane?

How does their statement model how we can come to the Lord in our trials?

How does Christ present Himself as a greater king than Nebuchadnezzar in this passage?

Compare and contrast Nebuchadnezzar's statements in 3:28-29 and 2:46-47. What do you think this reveals about Nebuchadnezzar's faith?

What convicted you from this passage? What brought you comfort? What brought confirmation that your salvation is secure?
