

*DANIEL 4:1-18 ~ November 15, 2020*

Compare/Contrast 4:1-3 with 3:28-29 and 2:46-47. What does this say to us?

How does Nebuchadnezzar's statement in 4:1-3 feel out of place with 4:4-18? Is there an explanation for the difference in the way he speaks of God?

Why do you suppose that Nebuchadnezzar was willing to tell his dream (and only require an interpretation), instead of making them recite and interpret the dream, like before?

Compare and contrast Nebuchadnezzar's vision with Matthew 13:31-32. What does this say about the nature of the gospel?

Compare and contrast Nebuchadnezzar's vision with the Lord's prophecy about Israel in Isaiah 6.

Reread verses 13-18. Do you think Nebuchadnezzar truly needed an interpretation to explain the symbolism of the dream? Do you think the word was hard for him to understand, or hard for him to accept?

How has the Lord displayed to you His jealousy for His fame and glory above the glory of others? How hard was it for you to learn that lesson?
