

*DANIEL 4:28-37 ~ January 10, 2021*

Why do you think Daniel tells us 12 months have expired between the dream and this incident? How might that delay play into Nebuchadnezzar's attitude?

Compare this passage to Acts 12:20-23. Why do you think God so drastically strikes down a proud leader?

What's your accomplishment that most tempts you to boast, "I built that?" How does God humble you from saying it?

How many ways do you see the grace of God extended toward Nebuchadnezzar in this passage? How is that also a grace to Israel?

How long do you suppose the "seven periods of time" were? What do you think it was like to live in Babylon (as an exile) during this period?

The end of the chapter is the last we hear from Nebuchadnezzar. Go back and review the last four chapters to see how Nebuchadnezzar speaks about God. Has there been any change?

How has the storyline of Nebuchadnezzar called you to hope more in the gospel?
