How should brothers (or sisters) resolve a conflict?

Some churches has wrongly applied this passage to issues of crime or abuse, saying a believer should never press charges or testify. Are there Scriptures you can think of that would refute such a view?

As for this passage, what hints does Paul give that he's not talking about criminal behavior?

Paul says, "Do you not know that we are to judge angels?" yet no one is sure what reference he is talking about (*maybe* Daniel 7:22). What do you think is the ultimate point he is getting at?

What is Paul's chief concern about these lawsuits?

Willingly letting someone take advantage of us is hard to do. How does the gospel help motivate and inform us to be willing to suffer loss for the kingdom's sake?
