

1 CORINTHIANS

1 Corinthians 6:9-11

February 13, 2022

It can be easy to see each week's passage as a separate unit. How does the word "unrighteous" in verse 1 & 9 remind us to tie these two passages together? How do you see this paragraph flowing right out of the point from the last one?

The world is tempted to make different tiers out of verses 9 & 10 (and if we're honest, so are we). Why do you think we're tempted to classify some sins as more severe than others?

Look carefully at the words in verses 9 & 10 again. Why is it significant that Paul lists these in the noun form and not as verbs?

Paul isn't saying Christians will never struggle with any of these sins, but he does say those sins no longer define us. How should that distinction serve the person who can't seem to get past their history of sin and guilt? How should that distinction serve the person who thinks their continuation in such sin is no big deal?

We don't usually speak of sanctification in the past tense. What gospel truths are proclaimed in saying you WERE washed, WERE sanctified, WERE justified?
