Check out Exodus 15. How is the worship of those people of God similar to the worship in this passage?

"Nations" is not a political term. What does "nations" actually mean? How should this inform our worship?

What "gospel threads" can you find in the description of worship? Which words stick out to you the most in the section that point to Jesus and His work on the cross?

How is this scene different than the "chubby cherubs sitting on a cloud, wearing a diaper, playing the harp" image from pop culture? Who is playing the harp? What is the context?

Take a look at Revelation 22. What will our worship ultimately look like?

Values flow from our identity, not the other way around. (As worshippers, we adore NOT we adore to become worshippers.) How does this passage help reinforce that proper order?
