Jesus gives them a task and then ascends. What other Scriptures remind us that He's not abandoning them, though He is leaving?

If someone argued that Jesus' commission is only intended for the original disciples on the hill, how would you answer them? What clues does this passage give that refutes that view?

Values flow from our identity, not the other way around. (As witnesses, we engage NOT we engage to become witnesses.) How does this passage help reinforce that proper order?
